

Joliet Township Government is partnering with Will County Center for Community Concerns to offer free tax preparation for all seniors, regardless of income, and other residents with income under \$65,000. Returns will be electronically filed, with refunds arriving in approximately 7-10 days. Last year, over 600 taxpayers received this valuable service.

FROM TRAINING TO ACTION: OUTREACH WORKER SAVES LIFE IN CRISIS



In a recent incident showcasing the impact of our Community Violence Intervention (CVI), Outreach Worker Harry Lee O'Daniels III saved the life of a boy who had been shot in the leg. After hearing gunshots in his neighborhood, Lee sprang into action. Using his "Stop the Bleed" training, he applied a tourniquet and gauze, effectively controlling the bleeding until help arrived. His quick response highlights the vital role our team plays in helping community members and save lives.

CVI BEHAVIORAL HEALTH HIGHLIGHTS: JAN. - OCT. 2024



In late August, CVI therapists expanded their reach by bringing essential therapeutic services to one K-8 school and two high schools, now supporting 36 students. This past quarter has been dynamic: CVI therapist Latreavette McCline, LMS, joined the Stepping Stones board in Joliet, strengthening community connections; Karissa Fleming, LCSW, completed a 3-day Sand Tray Therapy training; and Haydee Martinez-Rosales, QMHP, advanced her expertise through consultations for EMDR and TF-CBT.

This fall, CVI also hosted two trauma-informed community presentations. Caseloads have risen significantly, with 52 new referrals from January to October 2024, thanks to outreach, partnerships, and client referrals.

CVI COUNCIL: RACIAL EQUITY IMPACT ASSESSMENT LEAGUE (REIAL)

REIAL now includes over 20 members, including new partners like Sam's Club Joliet, Lockport Township Government, Non-Violent Cities Project, Road Runner, Community Mental Health 708 Board, MAPP, National Tube Supply, and the New Lenox Safe Community Council. Municipal visits have already taken place with ReImagine Village, and more are planned, including the East Saint Louis Police Department in FY25. To learn more, visit bit.ly/CVI-REIAL.

REIAL WINS COLLABORATIVE EXCELLENCE IN PREVENTION AWARD



Joliet Township Government's REIAL and Violence Prevention Council Coordinator LeShae Hudson, MHS, received the statewide Collaborative Excellence in Prevention Award from Prevention First at the Connections in Prevention Conference. The award recognizes REIAL's work with over 20 organizations to reduce gun violence. After the January 2024 incident involving Romeo Nance, REIAL launched an "Emergency Response Protocol" to improve community safety, contributing to a safer Joliet area.

WATER WEATHER Reminders

The Joliet Township Road District Crew is responsible for the Removal of Snow and Ice on unincorporated roads in Joliet Township. For the safety of all please follow these reminders during the winter months.

- MON'T CROWD THE PLOW!
 - Plow Trucks have the Right-Of-Way please give them space to work.
- During a snow event DON'T PARK vehicles on the street. Parked vehicles may be towed or street may not be plowed to avoid accidents.
- DON'T SHOVEL snow or ice onto the street or sidewalks. Snow put into the street will not be removed by Road Crew after streets have been plowed.
- During winter months DON'T PUMP sump pumps discharge onto streets or sidewalks.
